- Presenters will be allowed to present only two times if they submit more than one paper.
- Abstract for general submission:
  - 250-300 words plus one extra page for main references (title, author(s) and references are not counted)
  - o References must be cited following APA format.
  - Formats for proposals: .doc o .docx
  - Font: Times New Roman size 12
  - Line spacing: 1.5
  - Submission deadline: June 23rd, 2023
